# Window Cleaner

#### **OVERVIEW:**

Under immediate supervision, the Window Cleaner cleans windows and other glass areas in multi-story buildings, and prepares, operates, and maintains scaffolds and safety equipment necessary for such work.

## TYPICAL ACTIVITIES:

The following examples of typical work activities are meant to illustrate the general range of work functions performed by Window Cleaners; they are not meant to be all-inclusive or restrictive. Work assignments may involve other related activities within the scope of this classification.

Window Cleaners typically perform work involving some or all of the following duties: wash, clean, and dry glass windows, glass doors, and adjacent areas, both on the inside and outside of buildings and with special cleaners or tools remove paint and other materials which resist standard cleaning methods; make minor repairs to windows and window sashes and move scaffolding and other equipment; erect scaffolds and ladders and prepare for use other equipment and safety devices and repairs such equipment, when necessary.

## **MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:**

#### Knowledae:

Thorough knowledge of window cleaning methods, materials, equipment, and safety practices.

#### Abilities:

Ability to erect and work from scaffolds and strap supports on the outside of buildings at various heights; repair window cleaning equipment and maintain the equipment and materials in good order; follow oral and written directions; and read and write at a level appropriate to the duties of the position.

## Experience:

One year of custodial experience which includes some washing of glass doors and/or windows, or six months of experience in cleaning windows above the ground level on the outside of buildings, requiring the use of approved safety devices.
